

Geopolitics and Geoeconomics

The Geopolitics and Geoeconomics course helps students understand the connection between geography and the political and economic interdependencies in building the power play in contemporary international relations. The course provides an analytical framework for understanding major global developments, covering classical geopolitical theories such as Heartland and Rimland, as well as current challenges involving China, Russia, the European Union, the Middle East, and the Black Sea region.

Students will take part in debates, simulations, and case studies focused on international conflicts, national interests, strategic scenarios, and decision-making processes. The course is ideal for those who want to better understand the dynamics of major powers and the geopolitical and geoeconomic impact on European and global affairs.
