

International Financial and Banking System

The International Financial and Banking System course offers students a solid and up-to-date understanding of how **global financial markets** and **banking institutions** operate in an interconnected world.

The course explores the structure and functioning of **international financial markets**, the role of **central banks** and of **international financial institutions**, as well as the **dynamics of global capital flows**. The course also examines the interlinkages between the public finances and the private financial sector, the financial crises, the regulatory frameworks and the current challenges such as financial stability, digital finance, de-centralized finance and globalization.

Completing this course, students will be able to understand financial data, to assess risks in international banking and to understand policy decisions that shape the global markets. These competencies are highly valuable for careers in banking, finance, consulting, international organizations, public institutions and corporate finance, as well as for further academic research.

Choosing this course will strengthen students' analytical skills and foster the gain of practical insights into the domain of international finance, regulation and monetary systems. It is designed for students who want to gain deeper views in international economics, finance, banking and global policy aspects and who ideally want to complement their studies with a strong, market-relevant perspective.
